J.Y.Tulloch & Sons Pty. Ltd. is sold outside of the family for the first time to Reed Consolidated Industries, a publishing company from the UK.

1970

Jay loses his right leg below the knee after a car accident.



1971

Jay & Julia welcome their first child, Victoria Tulloch.

1972

Production of the renowned and famous Pokolbin Dry Red & Private Bin Pokolbin Dry Red cease production, despite Jay's better judgement.



1973

Jay becomes General Manager of the company and 60% of J.Y. Tulloch & Sons Pty Ltd is sold to Gilbeys Australia.

Jay & Julia welcome their second child, Justina Tulloch.

Ian Scarborough joins the company as winemaker and Patrick Auld joins the company as Lab Assistant.

1976

Remaining 40% of the company is sold to Gilbeys Australia.

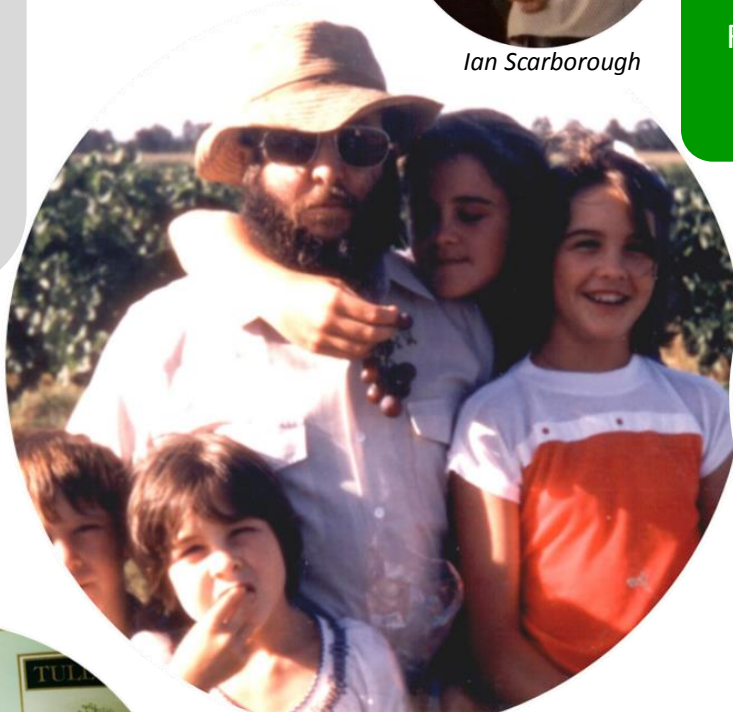
1979

Production of Pokolbin Riesling (formerly Hunter River White) ceases.

Ian Scarborough leaves Tulloch and Patrick Auld is promoted to Winemaker, a position he retains until 2001.

1977

Jay & Julia welcome twins, John Younie Tulloch (Jock) & Christina Tulloch, born ten minutes apart with Jock arriving first.

1982

Tulloch releases the first wine under the now famous Tulloch Verdelho label.

1983

Gilbeys sells the company to Castlemaine Toohey's.

1985

J.Y. Tulloch & Sons Pty. Ltd. is sold to Penfolds.

1986

The first vintage of Hector Limited Release Shiraz is made.



Jay & Jock Tulloch

1991

Penfolds buys Lindemans & Jay becomes Hunter Valley Manager in charge of Tulloch, Lindemans and Hungerford Hill.

1992

SA Brewing buys Penfolds & becomes Southcorp.

1996

Jay leaves Southcorp & founds the JYT Wine Co. with wife Julia. This is the first time in over 100 years there is no Tulloch family involvement in J.Y. Tulloch & Sons Pty. Ltd.
